Two Days, One Experience

I am writing this on the evening of the Bishop's Day Apart¹, an annual retreat for the clergy of our conference that the clergy of our conference is expected to attend.² The goal of the Day Apart is spiritual renewal and refreshment, with Bishop Watson taking care to blend large-group presentations and worship with small-group conversations and individual prayer and reflection. Is it something I would have chosen to do with my time today? Probably not—there's plenty I left unfinished at the church.³ Is it something I need? Absolutely.

I sat today in a room full of preachers, some I know, many I don't, and yet all of whom I think I pretty well understand, as they, no doubt, understand me. For instance, we all find ourselves longing for the holy but dealing with the mundane, only to find tucked there in the mundane the surprising presence of the holy.⁴ And we all stand on our own personal stages juggling priorities and needs, wants and desires, family and ministry, selfishness and selflessness. In other words, the preachers who will gather again in that room tomorrow⁵ aren't very different from you. I'm guessing, for instance, that you, too, do a little juggling from time to time.⁶ And I imagine you might even benefit from a spiritual retreat of your own.⁷

Sitting in a room full of preachers reminds me that I am not alone—in my weariness or in the exhilarating experience of Christian ministry. And sitting in the sanctuary with you on Sunday I'll be reminded once more. We gather in a divine fellowship intimate enough for each of us and bigger than all of us. We gather in the grace of God. We gather in the power of the Holy Spirit. We gather as we are and discover what we can be—today here at Simpsonwood and Sunday at Fayetteville First.⁸

That's a question I could raise tomorrow morning, I suppose, but since this is the Bishop's Day Apart, and he set the schedule, I think I'll just leave it a mystery. I've already served a four-point circuit.

Legacy Bricks to Purchase Vans

The church vans are eleven years old and it is time to think about replacing them. The vans are used to transport youth every Wednesday and for trips by various groups throughout the church.

To begin raising funds, the trustees are sponsoring the Legacy Brick Project. Selected squares of concrete in the main courtyard will be replaced with bricks. The first phase of the project will have the names of each senior minister that has served this church since 1827 engraved in the bricks. The next phase will give you the opportunity to purchase bricks in honor or memory of friends and family. The cost is \$50 per brick or \$45 each for four or more until January 1, 2011. Each brick can be engraved with 3 lines of text with up to 18 characters per line. Order forms will be available at the Welcome Center, at the kiosks, on the church website and at the church office. Simply fill out the form and return it with payment in the offering plate or to the office. Placing a loved one's name in the courtyard for future generations to see is a lasting way to honor them. These make great Christmas gifts, too!
