Five Lessons from FFUMC Rev. Kaylen Short

The question I receive most often when I tell people that I am a United Methodist Pastor is, "Don't y'all move a lot?" Many don't know much about the United Methodist Church, but the one thing that a lot of people know a little about is the itinerant system or the method through which we send our pastors. This notion that UMC pastors move so much more than others has always seemed odd to me. Regardless of denomination, the average stay of a pastor in a church is 3-4 years which is very comparable to the average stay for a United Methodist pastor. However, I do realize that there is something unique and I think beautiful about how our denomination utilizes its pastors. Beautiful because a lot of UM churches like Fayetteville First UMC become experts at welcoming and loving new clergy. I know because I have experienced it!

This Sunday, a lot of pastors across the North GA conference will be saying goodbye to their current church appointment and in a couple weeks they will be moving into new ones. So I wanted to write an article for you to share with your friends in other churches. Here are the five lessons other churches can learn from FFUMC on receiving a new pastor!

- **1. Be welcoming, not smothering.** It's important that churches receive new pastors and their family/ support systems with open arms, but it's also important not to smother them with requests in their first days. Obviously, pastors need to meet their new church family, but houses need to be organized, and offices prepared. FFUMC has been incredible at welcoming us without smothering.
- **2. Avoid saying, "That's not how ______ did it."** Since arriving here, FFUMC has given me an incredible gift in allowing me to be myself. Too often churches try to fit a new pastor into a hole left by a recent pastor or by one 50 years ago. God called the new clergy persons as they were. They can only be who they are.
- **3. Accept the honest "I don't know yet."** I am pretty sure that "I don't know" is the most common thing I've said since arriving here. Thankfully, you all see it as the honest statement it is, and not as undermining my leadership. Truthfully—even six months in, there are a lot of things that I just don't know and that come with time. Only just this week Isuccessfully transferred a call in our office for the first time!
- **4. Give balanced feedback, not only criticism.** Most clergy that I know desire honest feedback. It improves communication and leadership as it models humility. However, if feedback is always negative, then it isn't feedback: it's criticism. Feedback must balance what a new pastor is doing really well with what few areas they could iron out. Fayetteville First has done this remarkably and should serve as a model for other congregations.
- **5. Remember it's shared ministry.** One of the greatest things about Fayetteville First is that lay people are deeply invested in the daily leadership of the church. This is a tremendous thing for a new pastor. Too often a church expects the clergy person(s) to do everything because they are the hired staff, but churches can't operate their best if staff carry any more than a fraction of the responsibility for leading the church. Ultimately, the church will always be best when laity and clergy are working right alongside each other day in and day out.

I remain deeply grateful for the ways you all have modeled how to accept a new pastor well, and I ask you to be in prayer for those UMC churches and pastors experiencing change in these next few weeks.




Shawl Ministry
