One of the Best Things About Our Church

A while ago, I was invited by a member of our church family to visit one of the Alcoholics Anonymous meetings that our church hosts in order to celebrate his milestone sobriety anniversary. Before attending, he told me AA was one of the best things about our church, even if most people would never know it. After visiting that meeting, I understand why. So here are some things I believe the church can learn from AA.

First, AA is all about community. In AA meetings, individuals share their stories, struggles, and triumphs in a safe, non-judgmental space. Similarly, churches should cultivate a sense of community where members feel accepted and supported regardless of their struggles. AA encourages each member to practice radical honesty



with where they are in their journey and what their current challenges are. By sharing these things, they can be supported more easily by others in the group. I think we should be more willing to share our most authentic selves with those we are connected to in the church.

Second, AA has a clear purpose which they articulate regularly. So often churches don't really know why their specific church exists as opposed to all the other churches down the road. Even if members of the church do know, it's rarely said. I think we would do well to emulate our siblings in AA and to clarify our mission and purpose and repeat it often.

Another really amazing thing about AA is their mentoring. Everyone has a mentor and others who help hold them accountable. What would it look like if every new member of our church got a mentor who checked in on them? What would it look like if every new leader got a mentor to help carry the burdens that sometimes come with leadership?

Finally, members of AA celebrate together! They celebrate every single milestone and anniversary. In the church, we don't celebrate near enough. We have so many reasons to be joyful, but you might not always know it. We too should recognize and seize opportunities to celebrate all that God is doing here.

I left that meeting feeling so inspired by what AA does and grateful that we get to all play some small part in it by setting aside some of our space for them. My hope is that a little of the wonderful spirit and love of this church flows into our AA group, and that a little bit of their best flows into our community too.


All donations should be marked for "Summer Lunch" and delivered to the Fellowship Hall, placed on the counter or in the food refrigerator by Monday of each week.

United Women in Faith (UWF) are sponsoring the third annual Christmas Shoebox drive in cooperation with the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Warehouse in Decatur, AL. This project helps spread the joy and love of Christmas to children ages 2-12 in Central America.

The Christmas Tree in the Welcome Center has 100 ornaments for girls and boys of various ages listing the items needed as well as 20 ornaments for monetary donations.

Put the items in a bag and place the bag under the tree or return it to the church office **no later than July 1, 2024.** Monetary donations should be marked "Christmas Shoeboxes" and sent to the church office or given online through Realm and will be used for shipping costs and the bulk items (e.g. underwear, pencils, crayons, etc.) the UWF has purchased.

Very Important – Put the ornament in the bag with the items so that we will know what age group the items are for. 


Hope and a Future Capital Campaign Update

Members of the congregation attended Hope and a Future Capital Campaign information sessions on April 17 and June 2. Here's a quick update for those who missed the June 2 meeting. The campaign fund has \$687,000 on hand to meet the total campaign estimate of \$1,116,200. Fayetteville First will apply for a construction loan of \$325,000 from the Georgia United Methodist

Foundation to allow capital campaign projects to move forward while fund-raising efforts continue. With the \$325,000 loan, there is still a gap of \$104,200 so we encourage members to consider a sacrificial gift to address facility and sacred space deterioration. These projects are needs, not merely desirable enhancements. Each is necessary to sustain our capacity for effective outreach, joyful praise, active witness, and loving fellowship with one another far into the future.
