Like a tree Rev. Drew West

On our local church's order of worship, there are asterisks next to parts of the worship movements indicating that worshippers are invited to "Stand in body or spirit." At first glance, this means something quite simple, but the idea of standing in spirit is quite profound. It hints at something unique about being human: we can at any moment, despite how we appear on the outside, be connected to God on the inside. I may be seated at home and family and friends are unaware of how I might be standing in my spirit lost in wonder, love, and praise in response to God's amazing gift in Jesus. I may be in line at the grocery store, but my spirit is praising God for how God was present daily with us at Vacation Bible School just a couple of weeks ago.



At any moment, we can be deeply connected to God despite appearances. We can stand in spirit. This is an ancient idea. If you look for it, you'll find it all over the pages of Scripture, in both the Hebrew Bible and the New Testament. One of my favorite examples is Psalm 1. In Psalm 1:1-3, the author writes about people who are connected to God in an enduring way because they "delight in the law of the LORD, and on his law they meditate day and night. They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither." Notice how the writer of Psalm 1 speaks about certain people being "like" a tree which is planted by streams of water.

It's hard for us to notice the difference between trees being planted by streams of water or not where we are because we have a tremendous amount of rain each year, but many people who wrote parts of the Bible lived in dry areas and knew the difference a stream could make for the vegetation near it. Like standing in the spirit, Psalm 1 describes how we can flourish because of where we are planted in spirit. It suggests the possibility of how simple a person's life might look on the outside, but on the inside, they might be planted near the stream of God's presence and rejoice in the overflow of God's love from being connected to God.

I don't know about you, but I quite like the idea of being like a tree planted by a stream of water. This is what is available especially since Jesus has given us a new story. What seemed impossible is now possible. Jesus showed us that it is possible to be connected to the heart of God and stand in spirit, even during everyday life. Where might you stand in spirit and connect with God outside of Sunday worship?




NEW LIST: July pantry needs from Fayette Samaritans
