Mid-year Review Rev. Kaylen Short

We have arrived at the time of year when summer vacation is ending, teachers and students are returning back to school. At Fayetteville First UMC, we will soon begin resuming our normal activities. As activities resume, we have a temptation to look increasingly forward toward Advent, Christmas, and the end of the year. However, despite our temptation to begin looking ahead, I want us to spend a little bit of time looking back on the now completed first seven months of 2024.

In case you've been hiding under a rock, let me sum it up this way: A lot has happened at FFUMC! Lets just start with what's happened during worship services. We've had 29 people join



our church. We've celebrated 5 baptisms: one sprinkled, two immersed, and two had the water poured out on them. Our choir loft seems to be bursting at the seams with new members; we have new visitors each week; and we have Messy Church families coming to 8:45 and 11:00 and 8:45 and 11:00 worshippers going to Messy Church. Over the first 30 Sundays of the year, we have averaged more than 276 people in worship each Sunday which represents almost an 11% increase from the same time last year.

But wait there's more! Outside of worship, we are truly being the church. We began a ministry to extend our communion table to church family members who cannot be with us physically on Sundays. We collected 2,079 cans for our Souper Bowl Sunday with Rev. Lawrence taking the trophy (she won't let me forget that part), and more than 150 of you willingly came and ate my cooking on a Wednesday evening with ZERO reported cases of food poisoning. We've had church members serve on mission trips to El Salvador and a youth mission team in Appalachia. FFUMC continues to serve food to the homeless in downtown Atlanta, participate in home builds right across the road from us, and lead worship at Azalea Estates. We collectively delight at serving during Vacation Bible School and during Sunshine VBS.

There are countless other ways we have been an active and loving church over these first seven months. You have made and delivered meals to each other and those in our community; you've made hospital visits to church family members; you've created incredible prayer shawls to help people in difficult moments, and so many other things too numerous to name.

So really what I want to end with is this: I love y'all, I am grateful for every one of you, and I can't wait to see what God does through us for the rest of 2024 and beyond!






Handbell Choir: Rehearsals will resume for the Handbell Choir on September 12. Look for details soon or contact Judy Hames right away.
