My favorite passage of Scripture in the Old Testament is Psalm 46. It begins... "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." In the body of the Psalm the following refrain is found twice... "The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge." Between the two repetitions of this refrain is sandwiched my favorite line in the entire Psalm... "Be still and know that I am God!" If I had to summarize Psalm 46 in one statement it would be...God is ALWAYS there for us!

How often have you heard someone say, "I'll be there for you." Yet when the going gets tough, they are nowhere to be found. The writer of Psalm 46 is absolutely certain in declaring that God will ALWAYS be there for us, even when the earth shakes and the waters roar. There are recollections of bondage and exile involving the whole nation of Israel and no doubt there are personal memories of God being there for the Psalmist and those the Psalmist loved best.

In the New Testament the presence of God puts on a face, at first the soft face of an infant, and takes on a name – Emmanuel – which means "God with us." Jesus was, and is, with us in darkness and light, in joy and in sorrow, always and all-the-way to a cross. Elizabeth Clephane, in a hymn from 1872, puts it so eloquently...

"Upon that cross of Jesus mine eye at times can see the very dying form of One who suffered there for me; and from my stricken heart with tears two wonders I confess, the wonders of redeeming love and my unworthiness."

And we are unworthy, aren't we, for someone to "be there for us" in such a life-transforming way.

Leonora Younce is an attorney and sometimes newspaper columnist. A few years ago, she wrote of her father, a WWII Veteran and of the movie *Saving Private Ryan*. She told about being at a theatre where she heard a young woman praising *Saving Private Ryan*, then turning to an older man next to her to ask whether he had seen it. No, he said, he wasn't planning to. He was in the war, he remembered it all too well.

But then unexpectedly, the woman said to the man, "Well...Thank you for being there."






Youth Weekly Meetings begin September 4




"Growing As Parents Together" begins September 4
