


# The Weekender

#### **Holy Habits**

Beginning on September 4 with the launch of our church's new children's choirs on Wednesday evenings, I plan to begin working with parents of children through the book *Habits of the Household: Practicing the Story of God in Everyday Rhythms* by Justin Whitmel Earley (2021). Through this book, I started to realize just how important our daily and weekly habits are. Whitmel says, "Our routines become who we are, become the story and culture of our families." This intersects with the practices of "Spiritual Disciplines." Spiritual Disciplines are things like prayer, scripture reading, fasting, etc. Sometimes Spiritual Disciplines sound grand and glorious, but at the end of the day, they are habits that help a person be more aware of God's constant and limitless love.



But why do we need a new set of habits or practices? If you're like me, you already have a whole bunch of habitual patterns in your life, and your schedule might be full. Why add something new? We may need new habits because our patterns can either help us engage with God and our neighbor meaningfully, or distract us from all that God is doing in our midst: God is omnipresent. Spiritual Disciplines or spiritual habits have a way of interrupting our life patterns, in a good way, to help lift our hearts and minds to God's unconditional love and grace. Without good interruptions, we can become lost in the traffic of life.

I want to list three habits that I've found helpful in assisting my awareness of God. These all come from Whitmel's previous book Common Rule (2019). (1) The first is kneeling prayer three times a day. This entails kneeling in the morning, mid-day, and evening. Kneeling is not something we do often, but because it is so unusual it has a way of making my day more different and committed to Jesus. (2) The second is Scripture before phone, or before a screen. You can also silence notifications if you read your Bible on your phone. This is simple but effective. Screens often tell us what we should want, pay attention to, and do. By beginning our day with Scripture we can set our minds and hearts on things above. (3) Lastly, one hour without a phone/screen per day. Like the second practice, phones can shape and change who we are if we are not careful. By stepping away from them for a time we can regain a better sense of reality. I would encourage you to begin to try some of these habits and see where they might take you. I often forget these simple habits, or I make excuses not to do them. Yet, each time I do the small things above I find more joy and purpose in my day.




# Youth Weekly Meetings begin September 4
