CPR/AED/Choking Training Session

We all know in theory that it is a good idea to be trained in CPR. We know it's a good idea; but are we actually trained in it? Do you really know what to do if you needed to know what to do?

I hope so, but if not, you can.

First, a little vocabulary in case you forgot what these abbreviations mean.

- CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) is the process of helping a person when their breathing or their heartbeat has stopped.
- An AED, also known as an automated external defibrillator, is a device that applies an electric charge or current to the heart to restore a normal heartbeat.

If the heart rhythm stops due to cardiac arrest, CPR and/or a defibrillator may help it start beating again.

The Trustees of FFUMC, recognizing the lifesaving importance of having proper equipment and training, have recently updated our emergency response devices and have orchestrated a CPR and AED training session with the Fayette County Fire Marshal's Office.

Please plan to join us for a light dinner at 5 p.m. and CPR/AED/Choking training session at 5:30 p.m. on **Wednesday**, **August 28**, in the Fellowship Hall. There is no charge for the class.

1st - 3rd grade






Pantry needs from Fayette Samaritans


