I miss the people and their collective energy, the music that seems to fill the sanctuary and, of course, our cherished ministers, Kaylen, Allyson, Drew and Charles who lead us in worship. Being in church helps me feel more connected. It reminds me of hymn the we sometimes sing:

"I am the church. You are the church. We are the church together."

Last Sunday morning, September 8, I entered the sanctuary between the church services. It was quiet and empty except for the beauty of the sun shining through the stained glass windows and the huge cross behind the choir loft. In that moment the only words I could say were, "Thank you. Thank you." My prayer was one of gratitude for my husband's ongoing recovery and that I was home again to a place I've loved for a long time.

I joined FFUMC in 1979 and it's been home to me ever since. Being a member of this church is part of my identity. I'm proud to be a Methodist and a member of this congregation. The year I joined we worshiped in the beloved chapel; then the sanctuary was built in the 1980s; next the Family Life Center was completed in 1999; and a few years ago The Field was established. Now we're in the process of restoring the organ and remodeling projects. FFUMC is truly blessed!

Through the years I've seen our church change and grow. Sometimes it was easy and yes, sometimes it was hard; however, much was accomplished by working together.

This year FFUMC is 176 years old. Just imagine since 1848 how many people have called this church home and how many thousands and thousands of prayers have been said by those people called Methodists. I realize that all of the original buildings and locations are gone, but the history is still here. It's overwhelming! It's amazing! FFUMC is still here for a reason. We the church have more work to do and with God's help I believe we can continue to grow as a congregation.

If fact, this year I've been praying for 40 people to join FFUMC in 2024! If you feel led, would you also pray for more members to join us? Just maybe our new members will feel at home here too!




Pantry needs from Fayette Samaritans


FFUMC Flower Ministry:
