This is the culmination of a years-long effort to restore our pipe organ and equip it with the latest technology for, literally, generations to come. A fine pipe organ is both technology and art. Those who build them are master craftsmen in the field who specialize in building organs that will last a lifetime. We have enjoyed in this project the benefit of three such craftsmen: Roger Colby and Co. (console), Walker Digital (electronics) and Dan Angerstein/Anthony Nichols (tonal finishing). These companies together have produced a one-of-a-kind work of art designed to be fully utilized daily for years on end. More than just an organ, this instrument helps to provide a soundtrack for our collective spiritual lives If you ran into any of these artisans in the halls of the church and asked what they were doing - all, to a person, would say we are here to install this organ - but, most importantly, to give the best we have to Almighty God!



Giving our best to God is what we all have in common! Music plays a vital role in the life of this church. Your commitment of money, time, and goodwill to this community through this active, caring church is extraordinary. Just like these master craftsmen, so you are giving your very best to God in lasting ways. It is appropriate we come together and celebrate God's goodness to us all, his blessing on our efforts, and the reassurance of his promise for the future.




#### **Pantry needs from Fayette Samaritans**




