
Shred & Recycle at City Center Park Saturday, October 19, 9 AM to Noon

The church elevator will be unavailable Wednesday Oct. 23. We will have elevator maintenance teams on site that day. Thank you for your flexibility.




Serve at SafeHouse Outreach on October 31
