The Time Charles Got It Wrong

Charles Wesley is known primarily for being a prolific song writer and the brother of John Wesley. Charles wrote thousands of hymns, and both he and John were unapologetic defenders of the theology expressed in those hymns. In John Wesley's Rules for Singing (found in the front of your UMC hymnal) he tells people to sing hymns "exactly as they are printed, without altering or mending them at all; and if you have learned to sing them otherwise, unlearn it as soon as you can." Similarly, Charles Wesley once discovered that people were editing and reprinting his hymns. His response was clear, that people should "take the hymns as they are" or that they should add the "true reading in the margin," so that "we may no longer be accountable for the nonsense.... of other men."



Yet, I am going to do something a United Methodist clergyperson rarely does: tell you the time John and Charles Wesley were wrong. When he was 32 years old, Charles wrote the beloved Christmas hymn "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing." The only problem is he wrote "Hark, How all the welkin rings," as the prominent line. Apparently, welkin was a term for the vault of heaven.

I don't know about you, but I have an extremely difficult time imagining myself cuddled up as a child with my parents at Christmas Eve candlelight service heartily singing "Hark! How all the welkin rings!" I imagine that song would've been lost to the sands of time. Fortunately, the Wesleys' good friend (and much more fiery preacher) George Whitefield changed the words to the now known ones. In doing so, George proved once and for all that sometimes even the Wesley brothers got it wrong the first time around.

As we approach Christmas if you make a mess of first attempt at wrapping a gift, your first batch of cookies, or your 1,000,000th attempt to be more joyful and peaceful then just turn on "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing" and remember things don't have to be right right away as long as they get there eventually.

Poinsettia orders due Monday, December 16

Holiday Commemorative Brick Project

Place a commemorative brick in the church courtyard this holiday season! You may personalize a brick for yourself or your family, honor a loved one, or make a memoriam. Commemorate a new baby, baptism, graduation, friendship, ministry, church membership, or new home. The cost is \$100 per brick. Each 8"x4" brick can be engraved with three lines of text with up to 15 characters per line. Christmas gifts to change lives in El Salvador





There is a Christmas gift that can change a child's life forever. That gift is education. Tuition for a child to attend the Methodist School in El Salvador is just \$40 per month or \$480 per year. Two South West District mission teams are heading to El Salvador February 8-15, 2025, and February 15-22, 2025. The teams comprise 19 individuals from five different churches and are collecting money to help deserving children whose families cannot afford even this small amount. The school offers grades 1-10, the only grades that schools there have. The school helps keep the kids out of gangs, drugs, and the risk of human trafficking. The kids learn the usual subjects that we have here, including music. Their marching band has won national competitions. Many of the students are also learning English, which will open many more opportunities for good jobs. The school offers hope to the community.

Christmas on the Square



Doing what we can

When Gloria Wright heard that her hometown of Greeneville, Tennessee, was devastated by Hurricane Helene on October 3, she knew she had to help. With a carload of donations from her UWF Circle and other friends including \$500, she traveled to the area and spent 10 days assessing and delivering aid. A contact working with the victims helped her concentrate her efforts on a cul-de-sac where five homes were flooded. Insulation, ceilings, beds, appliances, sinks: all of it had gone down the river with force. When she left Greeneville, these homes were down to the studs and the task of removing mud was beginning.

FFUMC's Mission Commitee has given Gloria funds she can use in early January when she returns to assist these same families as they work to put their homes back together.
