I know a sermon has struck a cord when people ask me questions in the days that follow. In response to last Sunday's sermon about John the Baptist, I have already had a few people ask me: "How do I know if I am doing my part, but not doing too much?" Fortunately, on Tuesday, Nancy Musselwhite told the staff an excellent story showing that very thing and gave me permission to share.

(The following paragraph is written by Nancy M)

"I have a friend named PJ who is clear on her mission. She makes exquisite quilts for the homeless: quilts of the same quality she makes for family and friends. (One of PJ's quilts is pictured here.) She delivers them to homeless people living under overpasses in downtown Atlanta. On a cold January trip downtown, I was reminded how many people



live under overpasses — no matter how brutal the weather — and wondered how many of them sleep under a quilt made by PJ. I once asked PJ, tactlessly, 'Do you wonder about the conditions of those quilts after you deliver them? How wet and filthy they must be after months of exposure to the elements?' She looked at me and smiled gently. 'Nancy, my mission is to make quilts and deliver them to homeless people.'"

While I have a hard time imagining Nancy doing anything tactlessly, the example PJ sets is wonderful. Too often we let perfection get in the way of excellence. We fail to act because we can't address every problem. Discipleship is about performing your role and trusting God and other disciples to do the rest. Who knows, maybe someone has started a laundry ministry and has been cleaning all those blankets!

School Sponsorships change lives in El Salvador

Education can change a child's life forever. Tuition for a child to attend the Methodist School in El Salvador is just \$40 per month or \$480 per year. Two South West District mission teams are heading to El Salvador February 8-15, 2025, and February 15-22, 2025. The teams comprise 19 individuals from five different churches and are collecting money to help deserving children whose families cannot afford even this small amount. The school offers grades 1-10, the only grades that schools there have. The school helps keep the kids out of gangs, drugs, and the risk of human trafficking. The kids learn the usual subjects that we have here, including music. Their marching band has won national competitions. Many of the students are also learning English, which will open many more opportunities for good jobs. The school offers hope to the community.


South West District Inaugural Meeting United Women in Faith "Gather, Prepare, Grow"


