That's 2,381 times that someone who might otherwise be hungry will be fed because of Fayetteville First. If you ever want to judge the effectiveness of any church, judge it based on the impact they have on the community around them, and in our case those soup cans represent 2,381 impacts.


Great Day of Service: Save the Date - March 29


High School Seniors: Apply for Ed Travis Scholarship by March 31

Clothes Closet Needs: Women's socks; Men's Briefs all sizes






Supports summer youth mission

Souper Bowl IV: Surprise Champion

Souper Bowl IV ended with a surprise upset this past Sunday -- the winner was not even a named contestant. FFUMC Youth pulled out a sneaky play in literally the final few seconds of competition to win -- by a single can. Here's the tally:

Total: 2,361 cans — surpassing last year's total by 282 cans!

What does that mean? Though Rev. Kaylen lost the overall competition his second year in a row, he declares us ALL winners. The soup cans along with crackers and peanut butter will be distributed throughout the community to address food insecurity with our benevolence clients and at ministries such as Fayette Samaritans, Rushton's Hope in Griffin, Promise Place, and I-58 in Senoia. And because we surpassed last year's total, the church staff will prepare and serve a special FREE Wednesday Night Supper on March 19 to celebrate.
