
Meet Bishop Robin Dease This Sunday, February 23

Great Day of Service: Save the Date - March 29



know you plan to be there by signing up here.




Titus II features music March 4

Lenten Bible Study for Caregivers


You are invited to participate in a Bible Study for Caregivers exploring *Give Up Something Bad for Lent by James W. Moore.*
