There are still a few of them around...road signs that read Church Zone. Just what, exactly, is a Church Zone? Is it an area where Church buildings are located? Is it an area where supernatural happenings take place? Is it anything like the Twilight Zone? Have you ever been in a Church meeting that resembled that remark? Church Zone...I'm thinking that it's more than physical places and spaces.



In our current hymnal there is a hymn that contains these lyrics: "I am the Church! You are the Church! We are the Church together! All who follow Jesus, all around the world! Yes, we're the Church together! The Church is not a building, the Church is not a steeple, the Church is not a resting place, the Church is a people."

We are the Church, we are in the Zone, when we are gathered to worship, to learn, to fellowship with others. We are the Church, we are in the Zone, when we are scattered across the community and around the world. Gathered and Scattered...A way of thinking about the Church, not a reference to hash-browns at the Waffle House.


Matthew 25:31-40 gives us a better idea of the vastness of the Church Zone.

- *Church Zone = Wherever the hungry are being fed.
- *Church Zone = Wherever the thirsty are offered water and Living Water.
- *Church Zone = Wherever the stranger is being welcomed.
- *Church Zone = Wherever the naked are being clothed.
- *Church Zone = Wherever the sick are being strengthened and healed.
- *Church Zone = Wherever the imprisoned are being visited.

Wherever there are human hurts and hopes, sorrows and joys, there's a Church Zone. How, when, and where are we using our resources, our gifts and graces, to be in the Zone? John 3:16 is a familiar and powerful reminder that The Zone has no parameters, no boundaries. Surely each of us can find a reason, a place, a way to serve in the Zone.

I wonder if any of the astronauts have ever seen the big sign that our God has hung on the Earth? The sign that reads "Church Zone."

See you at 175 East Lanier Avenue, Fayetteville, Georgia, on Sunday, if I don't see you elsewhere before then. Either place, we'll be IN THE ZONE!


Great Day of Service: Pick your project through Sunday 3-23

The 2025 Lenten Concert features the FFUMC Chancel Choir and the wide range of sound offered by our new organ. Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) was a gifted French organist and composer. His *Requiem* (Latin Mass for the Dead) was commissioned by the Vichy government of France in 1940 and completed in 1946 and is built on plainchant melodies with lush, impressionistic harmonies. You'll hear *Song Without Words* by Craig Philips, a contemporary composer and organist in Los Angeles, Dedicated to the memory of his late brother, this piece features solo cello and organ. Diane Bish, still perhaps the most well-known organist in the world through her Joy of Music television series, wrote her setting of *Psalm 121* (*I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help...*) in 1982. Her beautiful lines written for chorus are carried with a rhythmic, virtuoso organ part characteristic of her compositions. You're invited to begin Holy Week in the beauty of these musical selections.




Flower Arranging 101 offered!
