The Same Old Same Old

Have you ever been stuck in a rut? Every morning around the same time my same neighbor pulls out of the driveway in his same truck pulling the same trailer. At that moment my dog, Apollo, absolutely loses his mind barking at that neighbor in that truck. This event causes my other dog, Maddie, to start barking too even though she often has no idea what she's barking at. Usually, Abby then gets distressed by all the sudden noise in the house and starts crying herself. Every morning this goes on.

We've all probably heard somewhere that the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result. This morning occurrence is our little bit of insanity. Every day I find myself growing frustrated and agitated wondering why my Apollo can't just figure out that everything is okay and that it's




just the same neighbor as the day before and the day before that. Maybe it's time to try something new.

I think sometimes our faith is a little like this. We get stuck in a rut, and we get frustrated and agitated knowing that we want to have a different experience. Yet, every day we go back to our same routine, at the same time, and then we wonder why we can't break free of our rut. Maybe it's time to try something new.

Maybe to grow in our faith and experience the goodness of God in a new way, we need to adopt a discipleship practice that looks different for a season. Maybe we need to download an audio version of the Bible and listen to it in another person's voice instead of reading it the exact same way we always have. Maybe we need to utilize a more intentionally contemplative prayer practice than our typical one. Maybe we need to fast for a meal a week and give what we would have spent on food to a local food mission.

Routines give us comfort and security, but if we aren't careful our routines can also lead to complacency which in turn becomes frustration and agitation. Instead of completely abandoning your routine to do something new, and instead of just doing the same thing hoping it will produce a different result, why not try something different for a season and see if it works? Maybe I'll try letting Apollo out in the backyard before our neighbor leaves each day.




Pantry needs from Fayette Samaritans

Charles Higgs, organ | Guang Wang, cello | Nicholas Bowden, conductor **Psalm 121** — Diane Bish **Song Without Words** — Craig Philips **Requiem** — Maurice Duruflé

The 2025 Lenten Concert features the FFUMC Chancel Choir and the wide range of sound offered by our new organ. Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) was a gifted French organist and composer. His *Requiem* (Latin Mass for the Dead) was commissioned by the Vichy government of France in 1940 and completed in 1946 and is built on plainchant melodies with lush, impressionistic harmonies. You'll hear *Song Without Words* by Craig Philips, a contemporary composer and organist in Los Angeles, Dedicated to the memory of his late brother, this piece features solo cello and organ. Diane Bish, still perhaps the most well-known organist in the world through her Joy of Music television series, wrote her setting of *Psalm 121* (*I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help...*) in 1982. Her beautiful lines written for chorus are carried with a rhythmic, virtuoso organ part characteristic of her compositions. You're invited to begin Holy Week in the beauty of these musical selections.
