The Most Important Words



Our lives are full of words. Words are flung at us constantly in various forms of advertisements, alerts, and messages. We also put plenty of words out into the world through conversation, emails, and social media platforms. Yet, some words are more important than others. That is why at FFUMC throughout Lent we will be focusing on sets of important words.

At our Lenten Lunches we will be covering *Seven Words* by Rev. Susan Robb and examining the all-important words that Jesus says from the cross. In worship, we will be reciting a different creed from our United Methodist Hymnal each week as an examination of the words that our denomination has found important throughout our history. In addition, throughout Lent we will have a sermon series called *The Most Important Words*.


Despite all the words we say and write sometimes the most important words can be some of the most difficult. Sometimes saying phrases like "I Need Help," "I'll Try Again," "I Don't Know," "I Forgive You," or "I Love You" require a vulnerability that is difficult to muster in the precise moment they need to be said. Throughout the Lenten season, Rev. Lawrence, Rev. West, and I will be preaching on Scripture texts that directly relate to each one of these phrases. In doing so, we hope to connect these "most important words" to our faith and be prepared to speak to them authentically when the right moments arise.

I suspect each of us at FFUMC will experience some discomfort somewhere in Lent because of all of these important words. Some of us will lament as we hear Jesus' final words on the cross; others will be moved by the variety of historic confessions of our faith that we recite in worship; and still others will feel challenged by the vulnerability required by the words in our sermon series. Instead of fleeing from this discomfort when it arises, I encourage you to lean in and search for Jesus in the midst of that discomfort. The beginning of the gospel of John connects Christ to Word. I believe that Christ often uses challenging words to nudge us toward new life.




March 25 SAGE TRIP

Also - please bring a package of baby wipes or diapers for donating to the Pregnancy Resource Center here in Fayetteville.






Pantry needs from Fayette Samaritans

The 2025 Lenten Concert features the FFUMC Chancel Choir and the wide range of sound offered by our new organ. Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) was a gifted French organist and composer. His **Requiem** (Latin Mass for the Dead) was commissioned by the Vichy government of France in 1940 and completed in 1946 and is built on plainchant melodies with lush, impressionistic harmonies. You'll hear **Song Without Words** by Craig Philips, a contemporary composer and organist in Los Angeles, Dedicated to the memory of his late brother, this piece features solo cello and organ. Diane Bish, still perhaps the most well-known organist in the world through her Joy of Music television series, wrote her setting of **Psalm 121** (*I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help...*) in 1982. Her beautiful lines written for chorus are carried with a rhythmic, virtuoso organ part characteristic of her compositions. You're invited to begin Holy Week in the beauty of these musical selections.
